Letter To The Editor

One of the major subjects for discussion on this campus is that of rules, especially those for females.

The basic point of contention is the curfew rules. It is common knowledge that male students have no curfew, and that female students have a complicated system of sign-in times. This is inherently unfair. Female students in essence, are discriminated against. This entire argument can be summed up in one statement: If the females have a curfew, then the male students should also have one. If the male students have no curfew, then the female students should not have one.

The recommendation is

not being made to remove all curfews, but now that a criticism has been offered let a suggestion be given. Why couldn't a campus-wide curfew of 12:00 p.m. be instituted? First-semester freshmen females should be given a curfew of 11:00 p.m., and the rest of the boarding students, male and female, should have a curfew of midnight.

A campus-wide curfew would make security patrolling much simpler, and perhaps raise the academic levels of certain students.

SGA Prepares For New Session

The SGA Senate held its first meeting of the year of September 3, 1974 at 8:00 p.m. The main purpose of this meeting was an introduction to the Senate. Rick Trexler, SGA Vice-President, addressed over the meeting.

The meeting began when Chairman Trexler called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Tim McSwain, a Junior Class Senator. The roll was then called by Bidgie Buchanan, SGA Secretary.

The faculty advisors to the Senate were recognized. Mr. Joe Hoyle, who is serving his second year as faculty advisor, spoke to the senators on the importance of getting involved in work outside the Senate meetings. Mr. Melvin Lutz, who is serving his first year as faculty advisor, was recognized. Both Mr. Hoyle and Mr. Lutz extended their ser-

VICES to the senators. Dr. Arthur Nuhrah, who is the Senate Parliamentarian, was also recognized.

Mr. Bill Briggs, Coordinator of Student Personnel Services, addressed the senators on their responsibility as senators. He also spoke on the value of a Senate and the maturity the senators should have in carrying out their duties.

Senate folders were passed out to all senators. Chairman Trexler went over the folders, explaining different parts of it. These folders contain the responsibilities of the senators, instructions on how to write up a bill, and the rules of Parliamentary Procedure. Mr. Tom Poston, Director of Student Activities, also urged all senators to read the SGA Constitution in the Student Handbook.

Bill Barkley, SGA President was then recognized.

President Barkley stressed the importance of the senators to attend all Senate meetings. He also pointed out that the senators should be ready to work hard this year.

Russ Horne, SGA Treasurer, gave the treasury report. He stated that the budget for this year is \$62,000. Mark Walker, Student Center Board Chairman, also gave a report on the entertainment for this year.

The members of the Faculty-Student Committees and the College Judicial Board were then announced to the Senate. Nominations were also made for a replacement for Steve Fischer, and Rick Hill was chosen.

The last item of business was the appointing of the Food Committee. After the Food Committee was appointed, the meeting was adjourned.
