The Bulldog Band had the honor of being the first college on high school band to follow the dignitaries in their cars. They marched throughout Kings Mountain in the Bicentennial parade and upon arriving in front of the Vice-President in the stadium, they proceeded to play "Beginnings," a popular song by the rock group, Chiengo. They continued to march around the stadium until they reached their designated seats.

The day's festivities began at 9 a.m. in Kings Mountain High School Stadium. Several local groups

entertained the growing crowd while they awaited the parade and the Vice-President.
