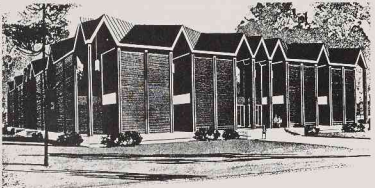

Guys To Get Curfews

The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare has sent Gardner-Webb a notice that unless regulations are equalized for males and females federal troops will occupy the dormitories.

In a recent speech at Wake Forest University, President Carter asserted, "I realize that Southern Baptists think they're separate from the rest of the country, but as long as you live here, you must discontinue these discriminatory practices.
