Where and how to get help

The disheartenment that pornography can bring on those addicted to it and those around them has many wondering where they can turn for help.

A Gardner-Webb male who had struggled with pornography addiction has suggested accountability as an excellent source of support.

The book of I John talks about honestly confessing your sins before men. Besides the power of Jesus Christ, finding a group of guys to hold you accountable is the strongest weapon to fight the temptation of pornography," said a junior male.

Other sources of help can be found through Christian web sites dealing with porn addiction and Christian counseling.

Though Gardner-Webb's counseling center provides free counseling to all students, counselors state that they have not dealt with many cases. Essentially, however, students claim an

individual must make his or her own decision to change. As a GWU male student pointed out, "There is only so much that others can do to fix the problem-ultimately, there must be a change of heart."


