

SWIMMING Team finishes second at meet

The Gardner-Webb swimmers ended their season at the Southern States Conference meet Feb. 13-15, recording a school record second-place finish while setting nine school records and placing five swimmers on the All-Conference team in Radford, Va.

The Lady Bulldogs scored 633 points while defending champion the University of North Florida earned 848 team points to earn the title.

Senior Cheryl Horne ended her GWU career with two victories. Her first victory occurred in the 50 free by improving on her school record with a time of 24.06. Horne also earned a victory in the 100 free for Gardner-Webb.

GWU freshman Taylor Simpson placed second in the 200 fly with a new school

record time of 2:08.46. Kourtney Hamilton swam to a pool record time of 2:23.87 in the 200 breast. Freshman Samantha Lehman placed second in the 1650 followed by senior Melissa Smith's fourth place finish.

"It was an awesome meet," said Smith. "Even though we had two disgualifications we pulled together and fought until the end."

Gardner-Webb's 400-medley team of Katie Thrall, Lisa Fry, Hamilton and Becky Henninger set a school record time of 4:04.26 to finish fourth. GWU's 400 free relay squad of Henninger, Jennifer Chester, Horne, and Jessica Mischel finished second. Chester finished second for the Bulldogs in the 500 free.

Horne became Gardner-Webb's first four-time All-Conference swimmer. (3rd selection), Hamilton (2nd Chester selection),

Simpson (1st selection) and Lehman (1st selection) also earned All-Conference honors. Head Coach Mike Simpson and the lady swimmers finished the season with an 18-6 record, besting the old record by six wins.

"I was very proud of our team this year for such a great performance," said Horne. "Not just at Southern States, but at our dual meets and invitationals. We stood strong and did not let losing a meet get us down.

"I feel that I ended my long career of swimming on a good note. I thank God for the opportunity to swim under such an awesome coach like Mike [Simpson]."

Gardner-Webb's swim team is graduating five seniors this season. The swim team's first graduating class consists of Kourtney Hamilton, Becky Henninger, Cheryl Horne, Hannah Lawrence and Melissa Smith.
