Volleyball supports "Breast Cancer Awareness"



Bulldogs extinguish the Flames

The Gardner-Webb men's soccer team dispatched conference rival Liberty University 2-1 on Tuesday night. With the win, the Runnin' Bulldogs improve their conference record to 3-3-1.

After a deadlocked first half, both teams returned to the pitch with a newly found intensity. However, Liberty was the first to strike. In the 48th minute, Liberty's Phillip Aseweh found the back of the net after capitalizing on a loose ball, bouncing in front of the net.

Yet, Gardner-Webb would respond nearly two minutes later. Senior Gerard Hefferon leveled the match 1-1, with a well placed ball by junior newcomer Romeo Kabanda.

Kabanda wasn't done yet for the night, as he again found himself in a promising position. In the 83rd minute, Kabanda blasted a shot, curving into the upper ninety of the goal for the Bulldogs to take the lead 2-1. John Sargent assisted the goal. This

proved to be the last goal of the affair and the winning one for Gardner-Webb.

Kabanda's able to share a comment after the game.

"Our coach motivated us at halftime to just work so hard and he never gave up on us while we were on this losing streak," said Kabanda. "That is meant to be one of the best teams in the conference and we absolutely outplayed them here, and they were a very, very good team."

Head coach Tony Setzer was extremely pleased with how well his Runnin' Bulldogs bounced back after the goal early in the second half.

"I'm tickled to death the way they responded," Setzer said. "We've got some injuries and some kids are sick right now, so that type of response is what we needed... Great game and great effort."

The Gardner-Webb men's soccer team will take the pitch against conference rival, UNC Asheville. The game will be held at the Green-Harbiton Stadium in Boiling Springs, N.C. at 7:00 pm.


