Throughout the season, the Seahawks have found themselves having to battle from behind to have a chance at the win.

"We've tried a ton of approaches, but for some reason we can't get past that point of being determined to win, rather than hoping to win," Rodgers said.

UNCW senior outside hitter Erin Fowler saw lack of communication on the floor as a major aspect in the loss.

"We weren't communicating as well as we should have. You could hear it get quiet on the court," Fowler said.

Although the Seahawks will not qualify for the 19th-41st CAA volleyball tournament, UNCW still hopes to finish the season strong for its three seniors, Fowler, Bailey Lee, and Britany Sutton.

"Now we have to be thinking about playing for other people especially with the seniors last weekend coming up," Rodgers said. "The seniors are such battles and competitors, you just got to want to do it for them."

The loss drops the Seahawks' record to 11-18 on the season, an ECU improvement to 5-18 overall. UNCW will close their home season with back-to-back matches against William and Mary on Friday and Virginia Commonwealth on Saturday, which is also senior day.

Women rout NWBL in exhibition

Sophomore guards Jan Williams and Jennifer Kapper poured in 18 and 17 points, respectively, as UNC Wilmington blitzed the NWBL USA Elite, 89-33, in a women's basketball exhibition game Saturday night at Trask Coliseum.

The Seahawks, who play their final exhibition next Saturday, Nov. 10, against another NWBL squad, coasted to a 44-12 halftime cushion and never looked back in the easy win.

Williams, out of Greensboro, N.C.,

made 7-of-14 shots, including 4-of-10 from 3-point range, as the Seahawks scored at will early and often. Junior forward Shameka Montgomery added 14 points and 11 rebounds in 27 minutes and senior center Vickey Harper contributed nine points and 11 boards.

Vanja Flowers paced the NWBL USA Elite with 10 points.

UNCW connected on 42.9 percent of its field goal attempts and 15-of-23 free throws in the contest while forcing 29 turnovers. The Seahawks only committed 11 turnovers in their first appearance of the season.
