When asked what truly made up the neo-war, Marschhauser said she really did not know.

Though the ECO organization has not taken an official stance against the war in Afghanistan, according to Marschhauser, most of those participating in the rant seemed to be opposed to the war because they were ready to take action to voice their opinions. She also said that she found it difficult to believe that 90 percent of Americans support the war.

ECO Vice-President Chessie Ferrell said most people on campus do not agree with the ECO members.

"I think a lot of environmental issues have to deal with social justice," ECO vice-president, Ferrell said.

Leon Buchanan, a sophomore and member of the National Guard, said that though people express their problems with the war, no one is providing solutions. Buchanan also spoke at the rant.

"I think that this rant is a good thing, but I don't think that it represents a diverse opinion," said Buchanan.
