Judicial Branch

Many students, including myself, have begun to have some worry as to whether or not we have a student Honor Court. The present student Honor Court has been reduced to a mere reviewer of decisions made in the dorm councils and may not handle any major decisions that could involve suspension or expulsion. The Student Faculty Judiciary Committee is the major judicial body on campus. Its membership consists of five students and four faculty members and deals with all cases that would involve suspension or expulsion.

It was felt in the spring convention last year that the old judicial system, where we had an entire Student Honor Court and a separate Faculty Judicial Review that students could appeal to, was too slow and involved. To cure the ills of the double trial system the present Student Faculty Judiciary Committe was set up.

The fact that the Faculty Review body did not once reverse a decision set down by the Student Honor Council last year would appear evidence enough that the students acted in the best interest of the college and their fellow students. It would then seem plausible to have a Student Honor Court where the final word would rest upon the students and the President of the College.

A second point concerning the judicial system at St. Andrews is its frequent infringement upon judicial procedure. Although it is largely the students' fault officers, President, Vice for allowing the judicial branch
