

# Harriers Break Even; Place Second In DIAC

St. Andrews cross-country team lost a closely contested 23-33 match to Pembroke Tuesday afternoon on the Pembroke 3.8 mile course. This was the final meet of the season as the Knights finished with a respectable 3-3 record in their first year of competition.

The Knight harriers demonstrated that they are going to be a power to reckon with next year as they finished in second place behind a strong Lynchburg team in the Dixie Intercollegiate Athletic Conference meet held on the St. Andrews campus last Saturday. In summing up the meet coach Ollis stated, "I thought we could win it but Lynchburg had a little better team than I thought. We lost four boys during the season and this hampered our efforts to a great extent." He also added that number two man George Britt was handicapped by muscle cramps in the last two encounters.

Coach Ollis is very optimistic about next year. "We look forward to next year. We hope to have a 12 meet schedule and everyone will be returning except George Britt. Cross-Country requires a lot of extra work on the part of a boy. We had only three weeks to get ready this year. Cross-country demands year round training to keep up your strength and lung capacity. We'll be in better shape next year."

### MEET RESULTS

In the Pembroke meet, Brown of Pembroke, captured first place with an exceptionally fast time of 20:32. Jim Smith led the Knights in capturing third spot with a

time of 21:59. Close on his heels in fourth position was George Britt at 22:35. J. Van Reed took sixth place with a time of 23:57 and Bill Barry was in ninth spot with a 24:21 time.

The meet was much closer than indicated by the score.

## Early IM Results
