The Knights bowling squad this season has been progressively a tougher opponent and is now established as the team to beat. Starting off slowly, the squad ran up an 8 and 8 record during the first three weeks of completion. Since that time they have picked up fifteen victories against only a single defeat and now hold first place position by a slim margin.

The success of the bowlers may lie in these two aspects; good improvement. They have rolled their poorest games against the weakest teams and their best over top notch Charleston and Lynchburg.

The team has increased its early season average from the mid-830's to the lower 850's and is second only to Charleston in this respect.

This past week the Knights rolled a record breaking 2720 set headed by lead off man Frank Ligon with games of 208-179-213 for a composite 600 set.

On Saturday March 5, the Knights travel to Charleston for

the annual D.I.A.C. tournament. If the Knights can hold first place in their final competition match against Charleston and enter the tourney as hot as in their recent games, they will be sure winners.

What has happened to our basketball team? They've set a record for the '65-'66 season -- two games in a row.

This does, however, set a new light on the team outlook for the tournament. With only three victories for the season, it is nice to know that all three are within the D.I.A.C. and that only six of our 18 losses are in competition league play.

This will place St. Andrews into a different bracket in the league standings and will give them a chance to win in the opening night of the tournament, perhaps opposing either Charlotte or Charleston.

A win in the opening tournament game will give the Knights a birth in the finals on Friday and Saturday evening.

Knights Win Two

Bingo! The Knights have finally started clicking. In their last two outings Coach Boyd's boys have registered victories over the College of Charleston and Charlotte College.

At Charleston, Jim Saleeby led the team with 20 points and displayed sturdy rebounding. Van Taylor contributed 14 points and displayed sturdy rebounding. toward the victory, Roger Dixon pulling down 14 rebounds from the board.

Saleeby scored the game's first six points placing the Knights ahead, a lead which their opponents trailed throughout the game. Their shooting percentage was 41 percent, a higher average than in previous games.

"We just outscrapped them," Dixon accorded.

Against Charlotte the team

played somewhat sloppy ball, but still managed to squeeze in an underdog victory 75 to 69. Down 35-33 at the half, the squad capitalized on rebounds and played smoother ball throughout the remainder of the game.

Dixon dumped in 22 points for the Knights. Larry Taylor and Bryan Ferguson contributed 15 and 13 points respectively. Guy Starling scored only 2 points, but helped the team considerably with 12 rebounds.

"We are still making mistakes but they are occurring at times when it hurts us the least," said Dixon who is optimistic about the team's chances in the D.I.A.C. tournament beginning next Thursday, February 17th at Lynchburg Va.

The team appreciates the support they have been getting in their recent road games and hope to see a real supporting crowd at Lynchburg in the coming weeks.

Pfeiffer Downs Knights

The varsity wrestling team lost its latest endeavor 20-13 against Pfeiffer University at the National Guard Armory in Laurinburg.

Larry McDaniel in the 123 weight class was downed by his opponent in an 8-3 decision. Warren Maxton had the only decision for the Knights, defeating his opponent, Crawford, on riding time.

Tom Teal in the 152 weight class was leading in his match when the referee ruled a default in favor of the Pfeiffer wrestler, Fisher. Although this decision was disputed, five points were awarded to Pfeiffer which otherwise may have determined the match in St. Andrews favor.

Losing decisions in the 160 and 167 weight classes, Mole Powell pinned his man in his 42 seconds flat in the 177 class, Knarf Grier capped the match by falling his opponent, Youngling, in 21 seconds of the second period. This pin by Grier is his fifth victory of the season opposed to one tie and no defeats.

The grapplers now have an overall 2 and 4 record with four scheduled matches remaining.

Next week the Knights face Wesleyan on Monday and Furman on Wednesday, both home matches.
