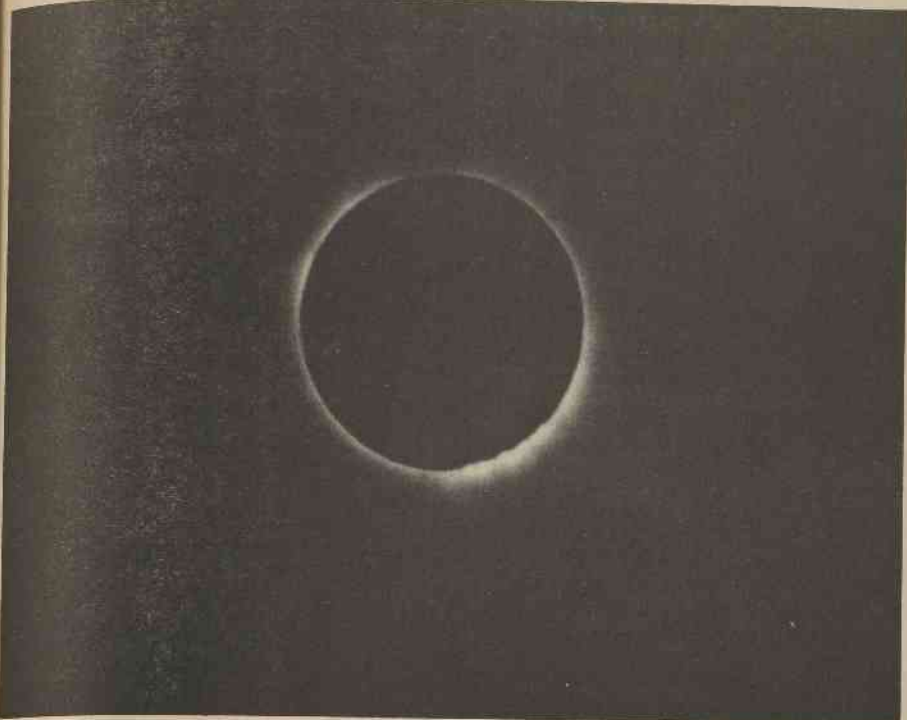


And The Moon Ate The Sun

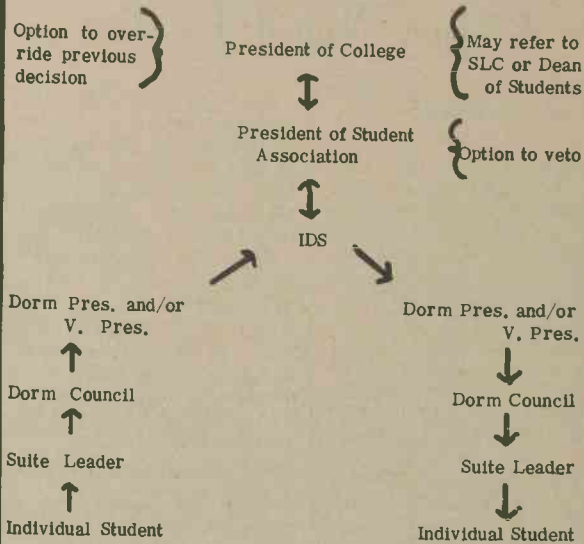
