

Knights Face Wesleyan Today SA's Power Reflected In Lynchburg Tie, Abbey Win

Two thrilling, yet crucial overtime games tested the strength of SA's soccer team. They responded well by tying highly touted Lynchburg 1-1, and beating Belmont-Abbey 3-1.

Playing before a capacity Parent's Day crowd against Lynchburg, the Knights got off to a slow start. Scoring quick-

ly in the first period, the Hornets controlled the game's tempo for the first half as evidenced by a 1-0 lead and a 6-2 advantage in cornerkicks. SA's first-half defensive play was highlighted by Hannas' beautiful save of a penalty shot.

The second half was a complete reversal as Lynchburg ran into a fired-up bunch of Knights. Unable to penetrate the Hornets in the first half SA finally found their weakness.

A hand ball was called on a David Mills shot in the penalty area. Cool, calm, and collected Don Cooper converted the penalty kick to tie the score 1-1.

Afterwards, both defenses stymied the offense attacks. At the end of regulation time, the 1-1 deadlock remained. Two five-minute overtime periods failed to change it. Fullbacks Bob Hasse and "Beef" LaGuardia were defense stand-outs. Hasse sparked with his aggressive play and daring head shots, while LaGuardia's long, booming kicks consistently stifled the Hornets.

On Monday, an exhausted team collided with Belmont-Abbey. Led by Don Cooper's three assists and an outstanding eighteen save (including another penalty shot) performance by goalie Craig Hannas, SA recorded a 3-1 victory.

After a scoreless first quarter, a Nesbit goal, assisted by

Cooper, put SA ahead 1-0. Abbey's Valledo tied it with a deflected direct kick. The score remained a 1-1 deadlock as regulation time ran out.

Thus the game went into two five-minute overtimes and SA poured it on. Don "Mr. Assist" Cooper blasted a shot that hit the crossbar. Leading scorer John Daniel converted the rebound for a 2-1 SA lead as the first overtime ended.

BA retaliated and had a potential penalty kick to tie the score again. Abbey's kicker blasted a fine shot. However Hannas, with his lanky, completely outstretched body recorded a fantastic save.

Psyched up by this superb defensive play, the booters increased their lead to 3-1 in the second overtime on senior halfback Rick Mason's first career goal. Again Cooper was credited with the assist.

3. Many fans, including myself, are confused by soccer rules. Therefore, each week in my column, I will attempt to explain some of the frequently misunderstood ones.

"Off sides" - Two men must be between the receiver and goal (with goalie as one) if receiver is ahead of passer. If not, offsides is called. If receiver is ahead of passer when ball is kicked is also offsides. A ball passed backwards can never result in an offsides call. Also, a man can never be offside on his own half of the field.

Chris Hayes handles the centering chores. Lavis Bowden plays end while Charles Burgwyn, Dave Allred, Toby Vosburgh and Rex McGuinn are offensive linemen. Mac Jones and

Jim Perrin are defensive specialists at linebacker and safety, respectively.
