
Nineteen seniors have been included in this year's selection for inclusion in Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities representing St. Andrews.

Registration Procedures Announced

John Craig, Registrar, announced today new procedures to be used for spring term registration.

All students will be listed by their Social Security numbers to insure accuracy and more efficient registration. Each student should check his card for registration for the proper Social Security number. Students who do not have a number should check by the Registrar's Office for application forms.

A new class schedule has been set up by a faculty committee to be used on a trial basis during spring term. Its purpose is maximum effective use of classroom space while allowing different types of classes to meet for different lengths of time. Most classes will meet on a Monday-Wednesday-Friday or Tuesday-Thursday basis.

Students who are in Junior C&C and who are also taking

STMS will be happy to learn that a special section of Junior C&C has been set up only for those who have a conflict with STMS.

Craig also announced that proposals for independent study during the spring term should be received by the division chairman no later than December 1.

Registration will begin Tuesday, November 17 and end Friday, November 20. Students will pick up their cards from advisors.
