

Recruiters for Peace Corps VISTA on Campus Next Week

Two representatives from the Peace Corps in conjunction with VISTA will be on campus on Wednesday, February 16 and Thursday, February 17, from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

The representatives, Delano Carvahlo from Brazil, and Ray Tidwell, want to give students a realistic view (both the good and the bad) of the Peace Corps. They will be on campus mainly to give information and counselling to prospective volunteers.

They also want to get on a closer one-to-one level with students rather than have form letters sent out or sending out representatives with memorized, flat information. "We

want to give students a chance," stated Carvahlo, "to sit down for a few minutes with us, if they are interested in either the Peace Corps or VISTA, and ask us any questions they may have."

There will be two films presented on the 16th, one for VISTA, one for the Peace Corps. The film concerning the Peace Corps is entitled "Triunfo", which translates "Triumph." It is the story of two Peace Corps volunteers who are sent to Triunfo, a small fishing village in Honduras, and of their experiences living and working among the people.

The Peace Corps and VISTA are, right now, especially interested in students who have graduated from college with majors in math, science, education, and business, and also anyone with an agricultural background.

The Peace Corps and VISTA are the two major organizations in the organization A.C.T.I.O.N., which was originated by President Nixon. There are seven organizations enveloped in A.C.T.I.O.N., who

all trying to keep their own identities.

Ray Tidwell has been in the Peace Corps for 2 1/2 years. For most of that time, Ray worked in India at agricultural extension. He worked with and advised farmers in grain and vegetable production. He was also responsible for caring for some of the wheat that was introduced to India by Nobel Peace Prize winner Norman Borlaug.

Delano Carvahlo, who is from Recife, Brazil, has spent almost five years in the Peace Corps as a trainer for volunteer workers who headed for Brazil. Basically, he taught the Portuguese language and many of the important cross-cultural customs and backgrounds of the people of Brazil. Delano feels that nations should learn more about each other and in that way rid nations of most of their stereotypes and stereotyped beliefs. "I believe in cultural exchange, that people must get to know and accept these cultures. Americans know as little about Brazilians as the Brazilians know about the Americans."

Senators Promote Heart Fund Drive

A fund drive to raise \$250 from the S.A. campus for the Heart Fund was announced this week by Chip French, co-ordinator for the Heart Fund Drive here.

During the coming week balloons and pins will be sold at various locations on the campus. One location where the pins and balloons may be purchased is in the Student Personal Offices from Mrs. Pate. A number of student volunteers have been authorized to sell the pins and balloons in the Dorms. In addition to these people the presidents and the vice presidents of each dorm have been authorized to both sell pins and balloons and to accept donations.

Recepticles will also be placed at various locations on campus to receive donations. At least one recepticle will be placed in the cafeteria at the end of the serving line. Money collected by the various people involved will be turned over to Mr. French who will forward it on to the coordinators of the Heart Fund drive in Laurinburg.

Mr. French noted that this was the first time S.A. had participated in the Heart Fund Drive and said he hoped students would take an active interest.

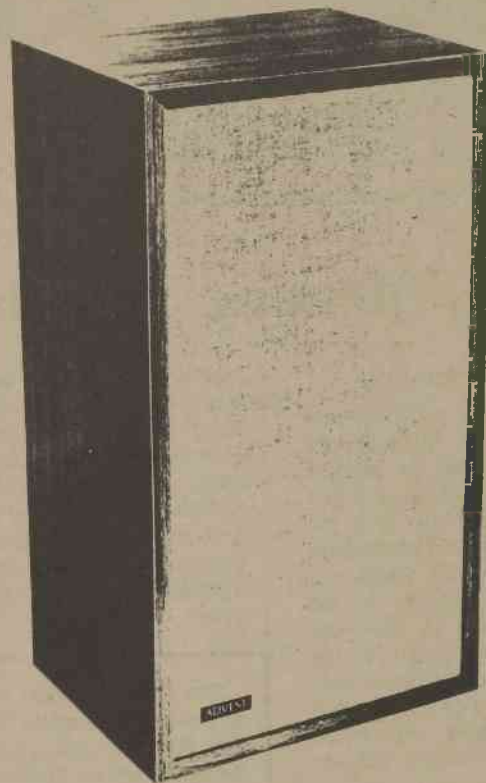
