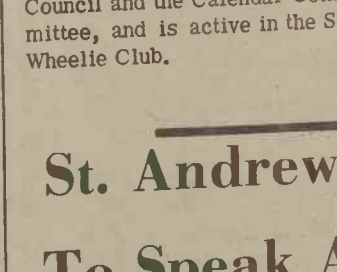
**LARRY STREET** -- from Charlotte, N.C., Larry is a religion-philosophy major and has been a student instructor in freshman C&C for two years.

## St. Andrews' University President To Speak At Oct. 26th Convocation

The town of St. Andrews has been a place of character and distinction since the sixth century when it was a stronghold of the Pictish Kings and contained an influential monastery of the Celtic Church. In the eighth century it became the focus of the national cult of St. Andrew and from shortly after A.D. 900 the seat of the most important Scottish bishopric, raised to the dignity of an archbishopric in 1472 and thus ranked alongside Canterbury in importance in Britain.

Earlier work in higher education resulted in the establishment of the University in 1411 and the charter of the University of St. Andrews was confirmed

in 1413 by Pope Benedict XIII. For centuries the most important university in Scotland, its coastland location kept it in touch with all the vital movements on the European continent, so much so that one of its colleges, the College of St. Leonard founded in 1512, became popularly identified with the Lutheran Reformation to the point that a sixteenth century cliche to refer to a Scottish adherent of the "Lutheran heresy" was: "Yee have drunken of Sanct Leonard's well."

Today St. Andrews stands as one of, if not the last of the medieval university towns. During term it draws its livelihood from its international reputation and position in education, and during the vacation

months from its resort facilities with much of this emphasis on the local Royal and Ancient Golf Club, the international capital of this game. With a population of just ten thousand it has the facilities of a much larger place. As a university city, in particular, it has qualities of intimacy and charm that make it unique in Britain.

J. Steven Watson, Principal (President) of Scotland's historic University of St. Andrews, will be the guest of St. Andrews Presbyterian College at a general convocation Thursday evening, October 26.

Watson, a native of the bordering English county of Northumberland, came to the Presidency of St. Andrews after a distinguished career as
