The BBC series, which took three years to produce, was first shown in 1972 and garnered scores of awards for Bronowski, a noted scientist and philosopher who died in 1974. Of the series and its purpose, Bronowski once said, "Among the multitude of animals which scamper, fly, burrow and swim around us, man is the only one who is not locked into his environment. His imagination, his reason, his emotional subtlety and toughness, make it possible for him not to accept the environment but to change it. And that series of inventions, by which man from age to age has remade his environment, is a different kind of evolution—not biological but cultural evolution. I call that brilliant sequence of cultural peaks "The Ascent of Man."  
The series will begin on September 23 at p.m.
