Fouke is currently taking one year leave of absence in Chapel Hill. The major also lost the Religion and Economics programs at the culmination of the 1975-76 school year.
The program has been taken over by Dr. Jones and currently has three participating faculty, A.L. Applegate, W.M. Alexander, and C. Bushoven representing Biology, Philosophy and Politics disciplines.

have complained that the have complained that the
original intentions. Unless changes in the existing program are instigated, the Environmental Studies major may be abolished or altered toward the science program
The feeling of some of the students is a dissatsfaction with the organization of the major and attitudes of the Environmental Studies faculty. The Environmental Studies courses take a lower priority to the full teaching loads of the faculties' own programs. A major contention involves the lack of Environmental Studies courses which are offered. The 1977-78 catalogue requires seven Environmental Studies courses with four at the 300-400 level. Many Environmental Studies majors have found it
difficult to fulfill the number of required courses which has jeopardized the contracts of several upper level students.

Faculty members have complained that they have been burdened with extra course loads in addition to their already full teaching loads. The lack of a structured program has made it difficult for scheduled meetings.
