Belize: An Overview

Belize is at the northeastern corner of Central America. The second largest barrier reef in the world, it is seventeen miles offshore in the Atlantic Ocean.

The population of Belize is 158,000. Main exports include timber, sugar and cattle. The tropical climate makes it a good location for growing citrus fruits as well. The mean annual temperature is 78 degrees F with a three to four month dry season from February to May.

The altitude ranges from sea level in the east to 3,000 feet in the mountains bordering Guatemala in the west. Per capita yearly income is \$840. The literacy rate is 80 percent...10 percent above Scotland County. Belizeans are

of African, Indian, Astan and European descent. Belize is not recognized as a separate country by its nieghbor, Guatemala.

British Honduras became Belize in 1954 when it began rejecting British control. Independence was won in 1981, and the present government is democratic. In November 1984, George Price, Prime minister for twenty years, was voted out of office.

Popular sentiment, particularly among the young, is optimistic that the change of control will help Belize's economy prosper. But some middle-aged Belizeans anticipate little to no change from the election results.
