Benson returned from the Far East by way of Seoul, Korea and Tokyo, where he met with officials to discuss the possibilities of international exchange relationships with St. Andrews. Benson noted that the College has a strong history of such exchanges. Through funding from the United Board, St. Andrews has had three visiting professors from Asia.

Benson said he felt a special pride in the work the St. Andrews faculty has done in building the College's Asian Studies Program. "It is argu-ably the best Asian Studies Program to be found among American liberal arts colleges,

a long-term replacement was chosen from inside the St. Andrews community, Reuschling would check with the Student Life Committee. If a long-term replacement was picked from outside St. Andrews, the search committee, containing at least two or more students, would approve the decision, pending the ap-proval from SGA.

Based on the conclusions reached in a student Senate discussion on this matter two weeks ago, Lenni Jones, president of Student Government, shares Reuschling's preference that the new dean be a former student or current employee of St. Andrews. "Familiarity with St. Andrews is more im-

portant than having a degree in college administration." Jones said that she desired a dean who would "work with students instead of trying to force new rules upon them."

Neal Bushoven, resident director of Mecklenburg resi-dence hall and professor of politics, said that he also desires someone with a St. Andrews background to fill the position. Bushoven called St. Andrews an "unlikely college" which called for someone familiar with its unique atmosphere and diversity. Bushoven believes that the dean should be "deeply concerned about the welfare, growth and development of students," and someone who values dialogue, and is not afraid to argue or disagree with students.


Many students inconve-nienced by the new system don't know who to blame.

During the Reagan administration the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Deficit Reduction Act was established to eliminate the deficit. The act laid out specifications on where to cut the budget across the board for all government agencies, including financial aid.


In December 1990, after Congress overspent the budget, the Consolidated Omnibus Reconciliation Act was enacted as an attempt to save the financial aid budget by making changes before Gramm-Rudman went into effect.

Ken McInerney, assistant director of Governmental Affairs for the National Association of Financial Aid Administrators in Washington D.C., anon-profit group working on pro-student legislation, says the new legislation is a burden on those schools with a low loan default rate.

"We have advisors in Congress working to help legislators review how the system is affecting schools," McInerny says.
