## Asian Studies Conference

St. Andrews Presbyterian College is hosting a conference to link liberal arts colleges with undergraduate Asian studies programs on April 25-26 in Pinehurst, N.C.

The two-day conference is sponsored by the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia and designed to develop the Arts and Sciences Institutions Asian Network (A.S.I.A.N.).

"The United Board of Christian Higher Education in Asia wants to build this network of colleges as an occidental complement to the network of oriental colleges. The benefits are enormous in terms of study and travel. I'm gratified by the overwhelming response of colleges across the country. I'm very proud that St. Andrews is able to host this conference," said Dean Benson, director of the conference.

Benson added, "The heart of the conference is brainstorming and creating the network. We plan to clarify what its nature, resources, and structure will be. We want to stretch resources between the U.S. and Asia."

Featured speakers are: Julia Ching, professor of religious studies, philosophy, and east Asian studies, Donald L. Keene, Shincho professor of Japanese, William H. Gleysteen, Jr., president of the Japan Society, William Malm, professor of ethnomusicology, and David Vikner, president of the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia.

The conference will end with a lecture/demonstration and concert on Asian ethnomusicology.
