An author, a businessman and a reverend will receive honorary degrees at St. Andrews Presbyterian College in Laurinburg during commencement exercises May 9.


Winston-Salem businessman and journalist Frank Borden Hanes will receive a doctor of humane letters. Author and educator Charleen Whisnant Swansea of the Isle of Palms, S.C., will receive a doctor of

literature. The Rev. John D. MacLeod Jr. of Fayetteville will receive a doctor of divinity.



Hanes has been a reporter, columnist, feature writer and copy editor for the Twin City Sentinel and Winston-Salem Journal and Sentinel. He has also written poetry and novels, including, "The Bat Brothers" and "The Fleet Rabble."

Hanes is a past member of the board of Directors of Merchants Development Co., director of Chatham Manufacturing Co., and The Hanes Companies. Active in civic and art organizations, Hanes has served as president of the Winston-Salem Arts



Council and the Rotary Club. He is also a member of the Board of Trustees of the John Wesley and Anna Hodgin Hanes Foundation in Winston-Salem and has served with the North Carolina Literary and Historical

Association.

In 1985, Hanes received the St. Andrews College Ragan Award for distinguished contributions to the fine arts. He has read from his works on campus and helped St. Andrews obtain funding for its writing and publishing programs.

Like Hanes, Swansea possesses both writing talent and business acumen. The Charlotte native helped found Spirit Square and started the



Charlotte Mecklenburg poetry-in-the-schools program. She now owns and operates Mindworks, Inc., and also teaches and lectures. She is publisher and editor of Poehouse Press in Charleston, S.C., and founder and publisher of Red Clay Books. Through Mindworks, Swansea provides training sessions and consultations to government, business, education and community organizations.

She received her undergraduate degree in Latin and education from Meredith College in 1954 and her masters in English literature from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1955. For the next five years, she studied in Washington, D.C., under the late poet Ezra Pound and published translations from Chinese poets.
