Lauren McDevitt, a Junior at St. Andrews, had this to say about SAGA: "Although I don't think it 's great, it has improved greatly since I got here three years


Much of the improvements and success today are due to the better quality of workers, their enthusiasm, and the implementation of suggestions made by students and faculty.
