
Selections from"The Table Beneath the Hand" were read at Fortner Writers' Forum on May 4 in the Bushoven Lounge of Mecklenburg.

"The Table Beneath the Hand" deals with the tension between being assertive and sensitive, and the conflicting emotions that tend to arise for a young woman growing up in today's world.

Her new found fame is having an effect says McVoy, "I realize how great the award is and it makes me feel more humble. I would love it more if people got something out of my work. This is my fifteen minutes."
