Some boys decide to go someplace and start off without asking what the trip is going to cost themselves. Several students have wanted excuses to leave school Friday morning to attend Saturday football games when they could have left Friday afternoon and made any point in the State in time for the game. Some students even leave school at eleven o'clock and miss a class when they could just as easily plan to leave at one. One boy want shopping during class periods when he could have shopped in the afternoon. Some go off during vacant periods and expect to return for class.
