

In addition to these exceptional major productions, the Players also plan two workshop productions: Neil Simon's comedy "The Good Doctor" will be performed in December and a bill of oneact plays will be offered in April.

The fourth quarter ended with an interception by #21 Darryl Godfrey, from Norfolk, VA.


