Being short, says Simpson with a laugh, has some advantages.

"By being short, I can get through some places that taller or bigger people can't get through," he said.

A Plymouth native, Simpson is a freshman computer science major. He played football in high school, receiving a coach's award in 1992. His position was tailback.

Simpson's father, Alton Simpson, Sr. proudly points out that height is no problem for his son when it comes to sports.

"He played little league sports when he was small and football in high school," said Mr. Simpson. "He was also in weightlifting class and the coaches continue to say nice things about him.

"We know his height bothers him sometimes, but we have always told him that the Lord made him the way He wanted to and that he was healthy and could achieve anything he wanted to."

Simpson Jr. said he has no plans to play sports at ECSU unless his "grade point average goes up" then he may think about playing.

Aside from schoolwork and computers, Simpson enjoys working with electronics. "It may take me awhile to fix something, but eventually it gets fixed," he said.

Besides playing sports, Simpson also enjoys listening to music.

He maintains a positive attitude about life regarding his height, but family members back in Plymouth can recall times when Simpson got upset after being teased about his height.

"Alton and a cousin were talking and the cousin got mad at something that Alton had said," said a cousin of Simpson. "Before I knew it, Alton had jumped on his cousin, who was six two. I wanted to laugh because it was funny to see, but I didn't. I realized that Alton got mad because the cousin called him a midget."

"Short people are treated bad because they can't reach places where tall people can reach," Simpson believes. "People shouldn't judge a person by his height because it's what's inside that counts. That's what makes a person."

Simpson, Jr. has a brother, Anthony, 17, who stands five' nine" and a sister, Kalisha,13. Simpson Sr. is also five' nine".

Simpson's parents say they are extremely proud of their son.


"I have always raised Alton to believe in himself," said his mother, Annie Simpson. "Being tall does not make you a man, it's how you carry yourself and what you achieve in life."
