ELIZABETH CITY, NC- Elizabeth City State University hosted the CIAA Eastern Division Bowling Event October 18-20 at the Albemarle Lanes in Elizabeth City, NC. This marks the second divisional event of the 2002 Bowling Season.

At the conclusion of the 3-day event, it was the Trojanettes of Virginia State prevailing with 28 points, edging the Lady Vikings who finished with 27. They were followed by Bowie State (23), Shaw (21), Virginia Union (11) and Saint Paul's (1).

North Carolina Central in Durham, NC hosted the CIAA Western Division.

The format consists of each interdivisional school facing off in a twogame match using a 5-person team. Three event points are awarded for each game won concluding with 6

simultaneous baker games awarding points based on highest total pin fall (6 points-highest 1 point-lowest).

At the conclusion of team match play, ECSU and VSU were tied at 24 event points heading into the 6-game baker match. However it was the Lady Bears of Shaw University spoiling the Trojanette/Lady Viking showdown by placing first with a total pin fall of 834. They were followed by Bowie State with 827 while VSU settled for 3rd (818) giving them the one point victory over the Lady Vikings who finished 4th (804).

Next up will be the CIAA East/ West Round-up hosted by Virginia State in Petersburg, VA October 25-27. The final Divisional Events will be November 1-3 in Raleigh and Fayetteville, NC followed by the 2002 **CIAA Bowling Tournament November** 18-19 in Winston-Salem, NC.
