


## Viking Football players receive Honors



Elizabeth City State's fall sports received news from the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association with the All-Conference football team announced.


Posey, a senior, helped control ECSU's offensive line that led to 126.6 yards rushing per game. As a unit, the offensive line allowed just 23 sacks in 10 games.

Defensive lineman Maceo Thomas was named to the first team All-CIAA after recording 65 tackles and 3.5 sacks. As a junior, Thomas had the first score of the year for ECSU when he recovered a fumble in the end zone against Livingstone in the first game of the season. Thomas ranked fifth in the CIAA with 15.5 tackles for loss.

Moore was among the CIAA leaders with 7.5 sacks, and tallied 49 tackles.

Three of the ECSU Vikings made the second team; they include: offensive lineman Steven Posey, defensive lineman Greg Moore and linebacker Emanuel Plummer.

Elizabeth City State University's football players, Emmanuel Plummer and Johnnie Walton were interviewed by ESPN recently for a segment that will air during the half time of the 2005 Pioneer Bowl on Saturday, December 3.

Walton and Plummer, were interviewed at the CIAA headquarters in Hampton VA. The two sat down in front of an ESPN interviewer and camera crew, to share their

experience of playing in the CIAA and more.

Plummer a standout for the past season was named CIAA Defensive Lineman of the Week twice this season and was named to the 2005 All-CIAA Defensive Second Team. Plummer tied at 5th overall in the CIAA in total tackles and led the Vikings in tackles this past season.
