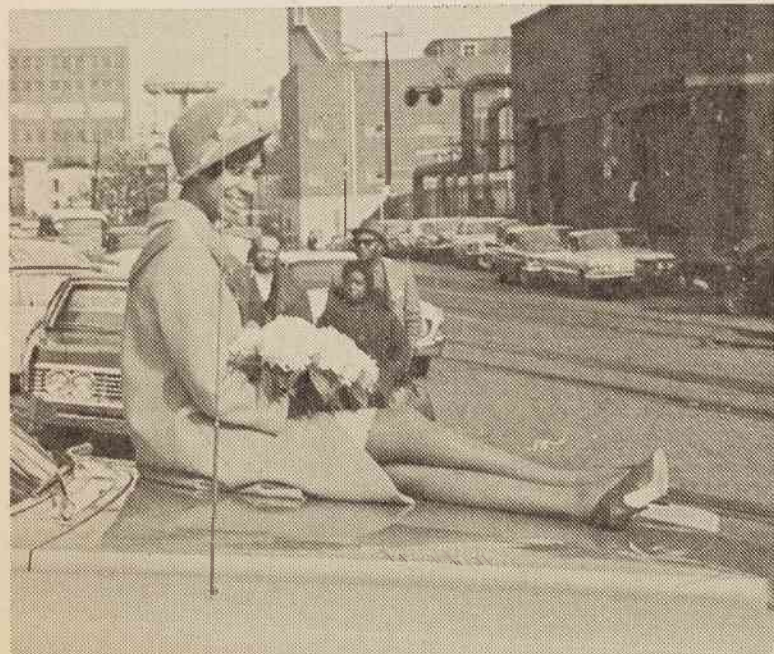
Miss Bernice Pender, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Pender reigns as Miss Omega. She is a graduate of Douglas
