## Omeegas Say Farewell

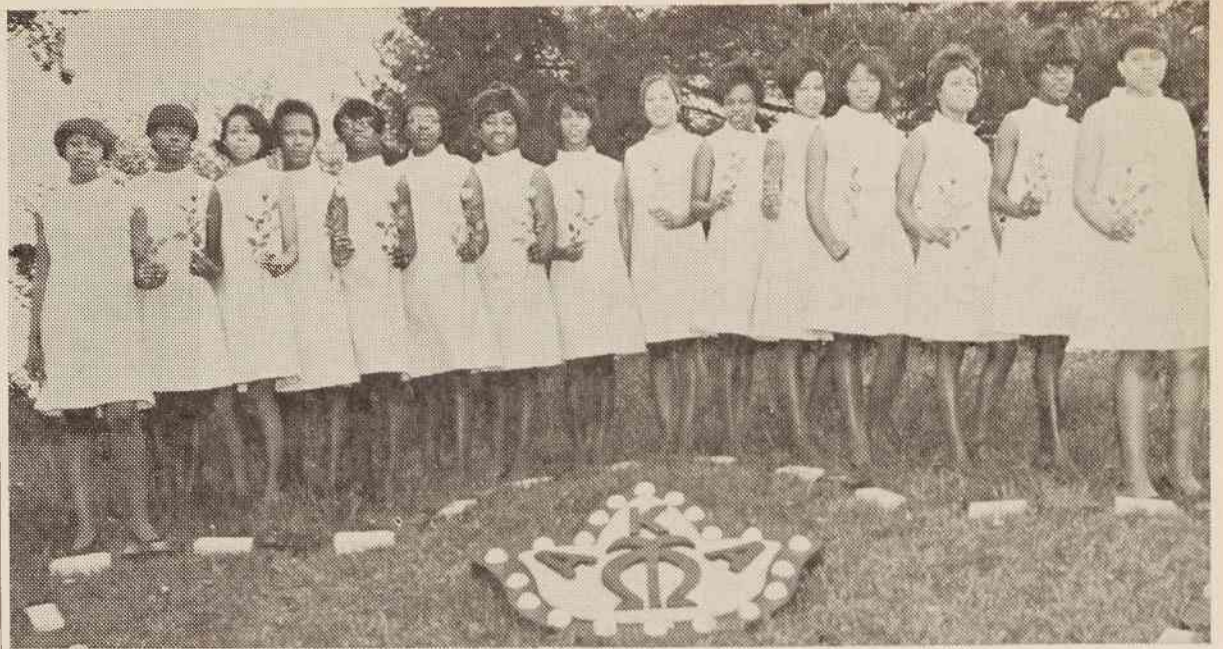
The men of Mu Epsilon Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity are terminating another school year by bidding farewell to all.
