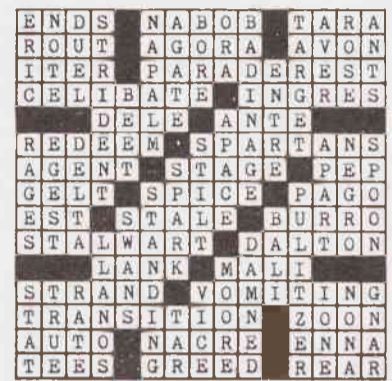
Drum Major Auditions
