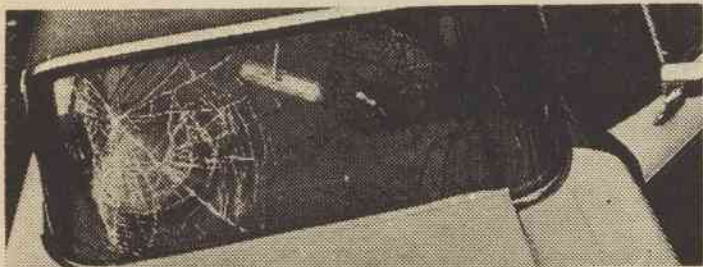
## Mr. Ram
