For any freshman, the transition from high school to college is horrendous. But for Donald Saunders and Leander Moore, it is just another stage in their battle to beat the daily odds of life.

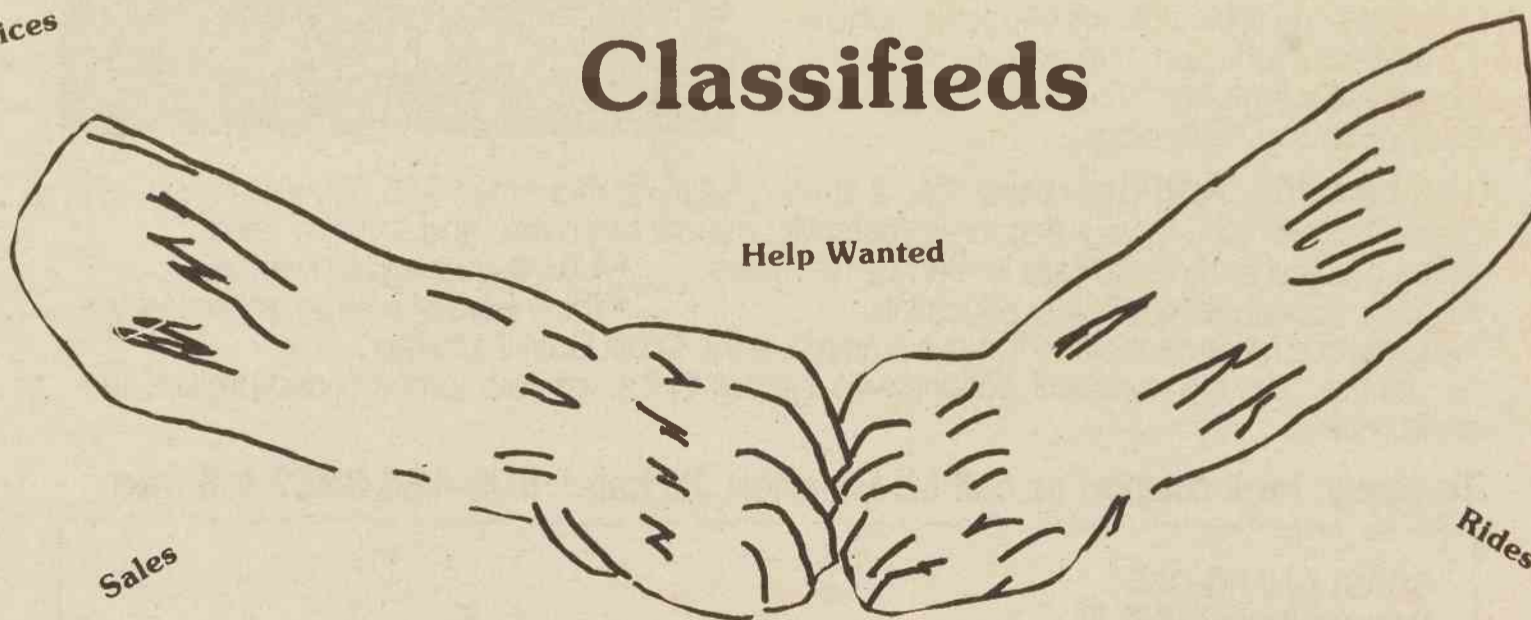
