The monthly pass costs \$18.00 and can be used any time on any regularly scheduled route during the month for which it is purchased. A monthly pass should be bought as near the first of the month as possible for maximum

The ten-ride ticket is \$4.75. It can also be used at any time on any regularly scheduled route. The rides are limited, however, to ten (10) per ticket. It can be purchased any time during the month and used from one month to another as long as it is unpunched rides. Both tickets have the benefit of free transfers

Two bus routes serve the

Winston-Salem State University campus. Route No. 3, Happy Hill Gardens and Route No. 26, Morningside Manor/Easton stop on Claremont Avenue and Cromartie-inbound and outbound. The No. 3 Route comes by every 20 minutes. The No. 26 comes by every hour. Both routes terminate downtown at the old Courthouse square where other buses may be boarded going to shopping centers, movies, restaurants, parks, recreation centers, medical centers and many other places in and around WinstonSalem. To find out where some of these places are-go to the Student Union Building and checkout our Schedule and Information Rack. The rack contains information on all 19 of our regularly scheduled routes.
