Dr. Elwanda Ingram, a member of the faculty, here at Winston-Salem State University is just one of many concerned citizens who protested against apartheid by demonstrating in front of the South African Embassy in Washington, D.C. on September 9, 1985.

Dr. Ingram and 49 other North Carolina residents participated in the protest against apartheid by giving their support to a group of concerned citizens called "Churches Against Apartheid." This group is a part of The Synod of North Carolina, Presbyterian Church, U.S.A.

Although Dr. Ingram is not a Presbyterian, she offered her support by participating with this group. They hope to show that the people of South Africa are human beings and have rights just as others do. The group participated in a worship service instruction on protest and the actual

protest. The purpose of the group was to protest, not to get arrested.

Although we are all aware of the apartheid situation in South Africa, Dr. Ingram feels "we can show our support by writing to our senators and withdrawing our support from organizations who lend their support and money to South Africa."

Not only were North Carolina residents protesting, but concerned citizens from across the nation have been demonstrating at the embassy since Thanksgiving Day 1984.




