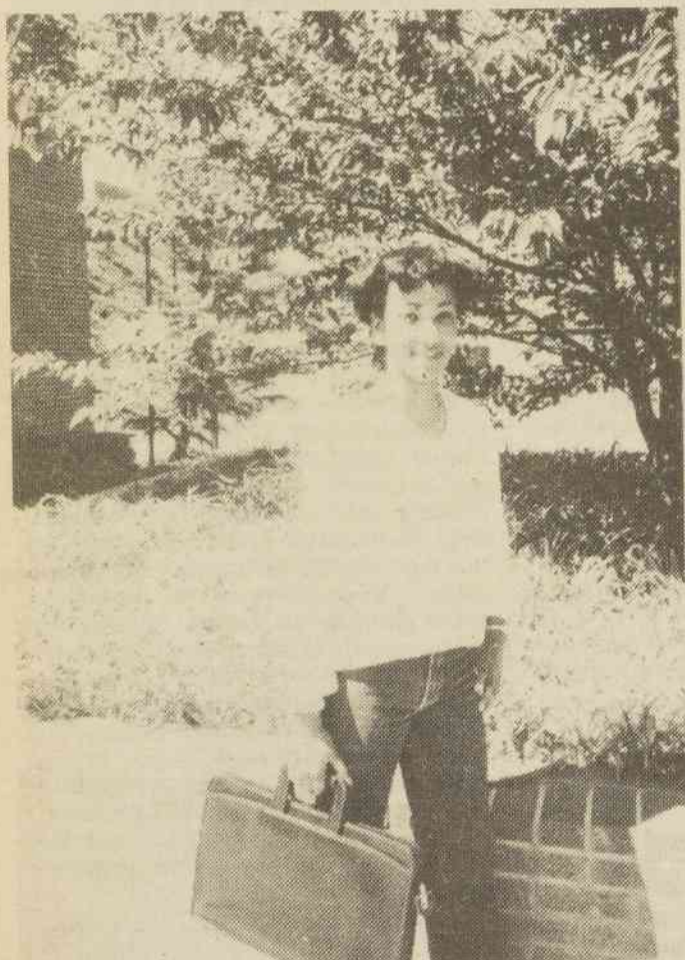
As senior class president, Robert Mack of Kannapolis, N.C., plans to work closely with the members of the class and to work hard with the other senior-class officers for a productive year.

He stated "I will need the support of all my fellow classmates. I am willing to make this senior class the best ever."

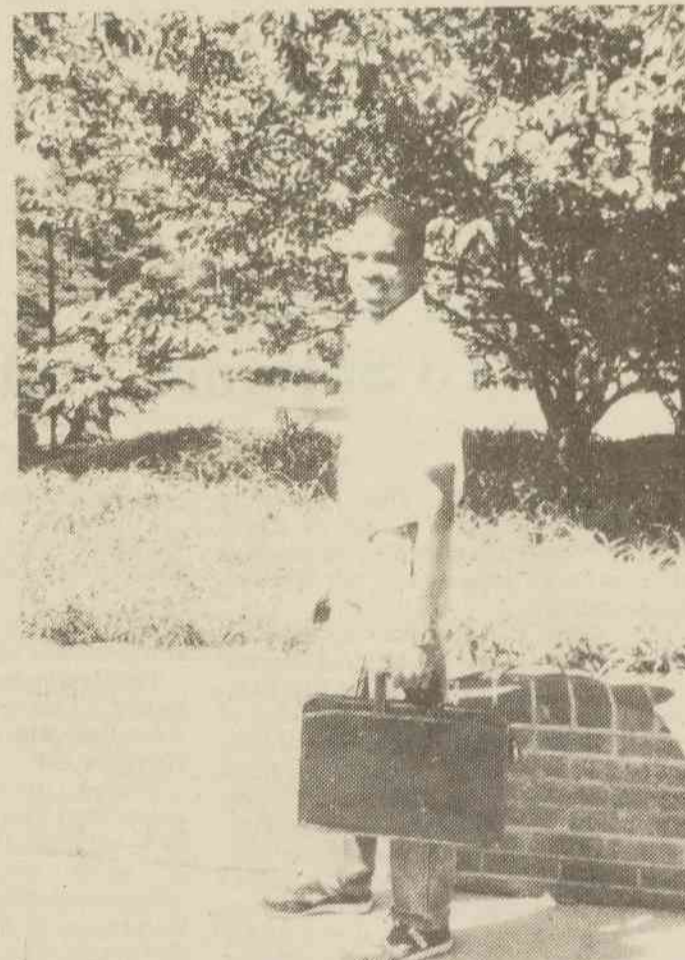
Doris Hussey, of Tarboro, N.C., the new class secretary says, "I plan to do my best in helping the senior class achieve its goals."
