Dr. William H. Bailey has joined the Winston-Salem State University faculty as the Chairman of the Department of **Business and Economics**

Bailey is a 1971 graduate of Tougallo College in Mississippi. In 1974, after specializing in Industrial Organizational Economics he received both his masters and Ph.D. from the University of Illinois at Champain Urbana

Next he served as Director of the Human **Resources Management Institute, and was** involved with training labor and management in the public sector at Florida A&M University

In 1976 he worked with the bureau of Economics and Development at Virginia State University. In 1976 thru 1983 he served as the Chairman of the Business Administration Department at North Carolina A&T University. During his tenture, A&T became one of the two predominantly black universities to receive accreditation from the American Assembly of Collegian Schools of Business.

In 1983 he served as the Chairman of both the Department of Business Administration and the Masters Program in Business at Norfolk State University.

In 1984 while serving as the Director of the Masters of Business in Administration at Fayetteveille State University, Bailey received an offer from Winston-Salem State University to become the chairperson of the School of Business, which he considered, "an excellent opportunity."




