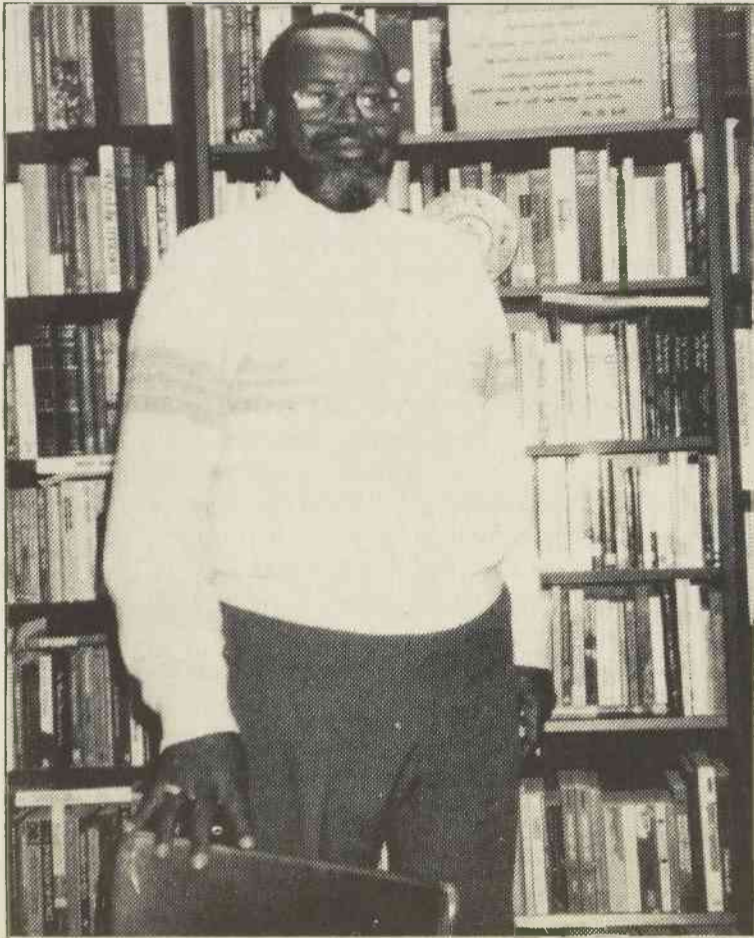

Dr. Lorenzo Battle believes learning should not be painful

"Today's black students need to improve their communication skills and their problem-solving skills," says Dr. Lorenzo Battle, a professor and the chairman of the Social Science Department here at WSSU.

Employed Aug. 1, 1987, Battle has brought to this university experience, expertise and a unique and professional method of instruction. He believes that students should strive for perfection, but that learning should not be painful, he said.

He earned his B.A. degree in history and political science from North Carolina Central University in Durham, a masters of art in Political Science from Columbia University in New York and a Ph.D. from Carnegie-Mellon University in Pittsburgh, Pa.

He has published several manuscripts and belongs to a list of professional and social organizations, including the American Association of Higher Education, American Association of University Professors, American Historical Association, Rotary Club and Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity. He is a charter member of the American Association of Black Political Scientists.

He was an associate dean at Miami/Dade Community College, a regional dean at the Union for Experimenting Colleges and Universities in Miami, dean of special programs at Biscayne College in Miami, director of program development at Shaw University in Raleigh, professor of administrative and urban sciences at Shaw University and vice president for academic affairs at Shaw College in Detroit, Michigan.

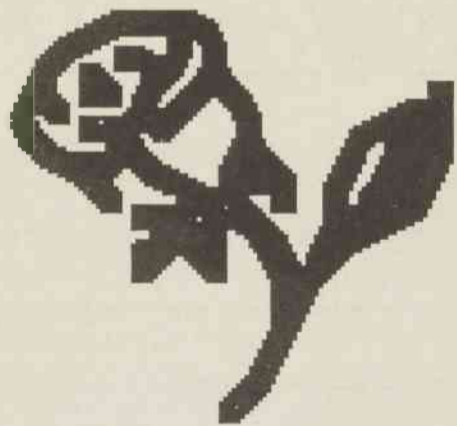
This is only a partial listing of Battle's outstanding accomplishments.
