A \$10,000 endowed scholarship fund has been established at Winston-Salem State University by R.H. Barringer Distributing Co./Anheuser-Bush Inc.

The interest earned on the fund will be used to give a Budweiser Scholarship to a deserving student.

Under the terms of the scholarship, the recipient must come from one of the following counties: Stokes, Rockingham, Caswell, Forsyth, Guilford or Alamance. The student also must be a rising senior in the university's Division of Business and Economics and in good

standing, as well as demonstrate financial need.

In presenting a check to Chancellor Cleon F. Thompson Jr., Bob Brown, R.H. Barringer's Winston-Salem branch manager, said, "We're good corporate leaders and want to return something to the community."

Volunteers for Teen Line requires 10 hours of training. The training consist of part of CONTACT's policies and procedures taught by Jim Fatzinger, who is the executive director of CONTACT of Winston-Salem. Other skills and training techniques taught include: listening skills, counseling skills, and on the phone training as part of an internship towards your training to be a phone volunteer.
