The College Foundation offers three educational loan programs. These educational loans, obtained through the foundation, are funded by banks operating in North Carolina. Other investors also participate in granting loans through the foundation.

The three types of loans are: Stafford loans for dependent or independent

students, based on financial need; supplemental loans, for dependent self-supporting students, not based on financial need; plus loans for parents of dependent students, not based on financial need.
