Many faculty and staff members have complained to the WSSU Security Department about not being able to park in designated faculty lots or spaces near the buildings where they work. The most common response received is, "there are plenty of spots down by the Gaines Center."

Mrs. Patricia Martin, the Department of Life Sciences' secretary said, " I paid \$50 for a parking sticker and I have nowhere to park. I have to park where ever there is an opening."

"I really don't think there is a parking problem," said Mrs. Elvita Hunt, WSSU's telecommunications operator. "After I visited East Carolina University and heard that they paid more than \$100 for a parking decal per semester (and this still does not guarantee them a space) I stopped complaining."

Mrs. Derrinita Manuel, a member of the Department of English and Foreign Languages faculty and Dr. Abhijit Sen, a member of the Mass Communications faculty, both say they now just park their cars in the lot behind R. J. Reynolds.

A year ago, Campus Security initiated a Color Coded (parking zones) System to help prevent people from parking in the wrong locations. Most people who park


