

Winston-Salem State University. Have you ever visited one of them? If not, don't worry, you haven't missed a


thing. Both are the size of three-anda-half




The flat bench is used for bench presses, and other exercises The one shown above serves its purpose, but allows perspiration to be soaked into the cotton shown
