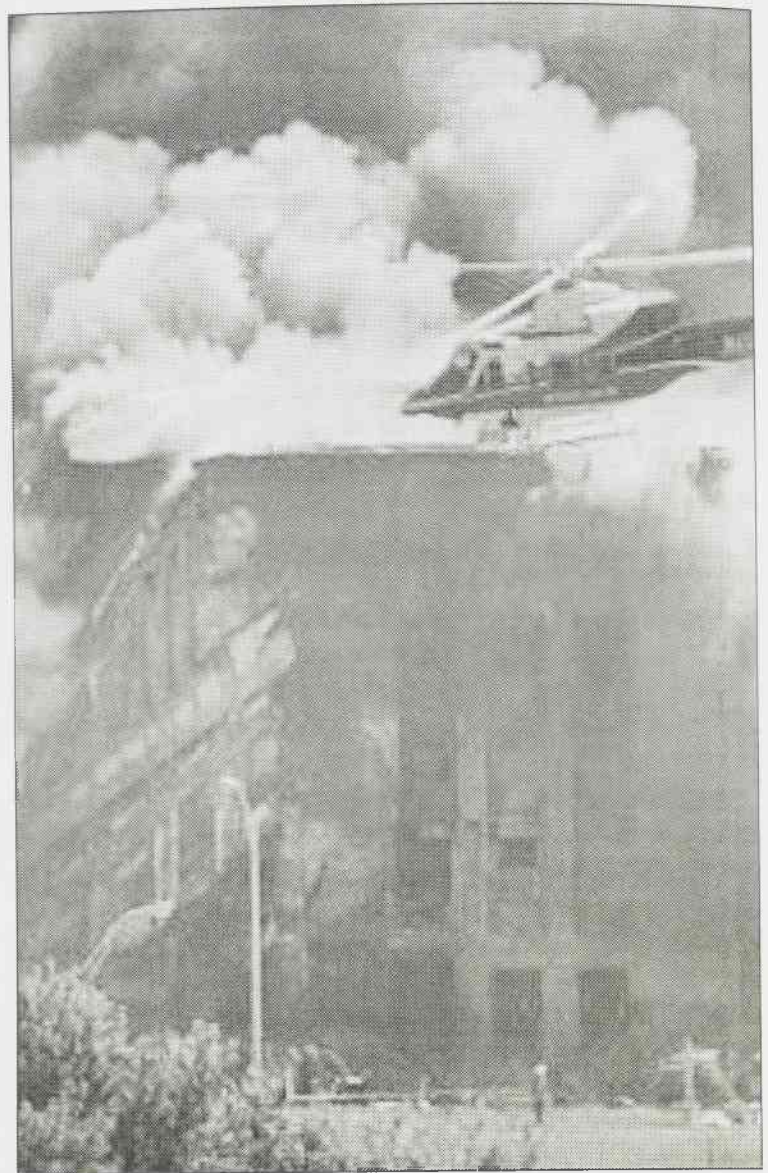

their wedding reception at a yacht club in Baltimore, Md.

"We loved her at Backus," said Nellie Cook-Jefferson, assistant principal at Backus Middle School, who recalled fond memories of Clark.

"She was an excellent teacher," said Cook-Jefferson.

"Just exuberant. Young at heart and young in spirit."

Cook-Jefferson and Clark came into Backus Middle School together five years ago under new administration.

The assistant principal said that Clark's age was unrecognizable, and she liked to exercise.

"She was just a teeny weeny little thing," said Cook-Jefferson. "You would never know she was 65."

Cook-Jefferson attended Clark's funeral and spoke of what a positive response there was from those who knew and loved her.

"You know it's a tribute [the service] when her ex-husband and children can say a eulogy and then the fiance closes the ceremony."

Clark who was traveling with 11-year old student Asia Cottom at the time of tragedy will hardly be forgotten at Backus Middle School.

Her classroom was across from the main office. Clark's exuberance and joy for life was said to be those of lasting impression on others.

"If I ever knew a well-rounded person, it was Sarah Clark. She and Asia walked in the valley of the shadow of death and saw no evil because they knew God," Cook-Jefferson said.
