The 1991 edition of Who's Who Among Students in American Junior Colleges will include the names of 29 students from Chowan College who have been selected as national outstanding campus leaders.


Campus nominating committees and editors of the annual directory have included the names of these students based on their academic achievement, service to the community, leadership in extracurricular activities and potential for continued success.
