

Youths take part in lock-in program

More than 525 youths from 35 churches participated in Chowan College's "Reaching In and Out Together" (RIOT) Night Lock-in program near the close of the spring semester, the college's first all-night inter-denominational program for middle and high school students.

The program was directed by Tim Wilson, Chowan's campus minister.
