## College Attendance Drops

The percentage of young men attending college has dropped significantly from the peak rates of the late 1960 s , the Census Bureau reported Saturday.
The bureau said, for example, that 38 per cent of all men 18 and 19 years old are attending college in the current academic year compared with 44 percent in 1969. The enrollment percentage of men 20 and 21 years old showed a
similar pattern, falling from 45 per cent in 1969 to 36 per cent in the current year.
The bureau gave no reason why, although some people outside the government have suggested that the enrollment rates for men in the late 60s was higher because of the Vietnam war.
The Census study showed that the percentage of women at-
tending college has either in creased or remained stable. In 1969, 34.4 per cent of women 18 and 19 were enrolled in college. In the current academic year, the rate is 34.3 per cent.
For women 20 to 21 years old, 24 percent were going to college in 1969 and in the current academic year, 25.6 per cent are enrolled in college.
The Census report disclosed

The reason was the decline in
the number of births in the United States during the 1960s, the bureau said.
