Honor Students

A record number of 10 students have been named to the President's List for straight A work during the fall semester at Chowan College. The previous record was eight recorded in 1972 and again in 1973.

Chowan students also produced academic records for the highest percentage of the student body named to the Dean's and Honors lists. Fifty-five students were named to the Dean's List for maintaining a grade average between 3.50-3.99 on a 4.00 system and 106 to the Honors List for recording a B average with no grade lower than C.

During the fall semester a total of 171 students representing approximately 17 percent of

Chowan's enrollment of 1,009 students earned a place on one of the three honors lists. This was also a record for the highest percentage.
