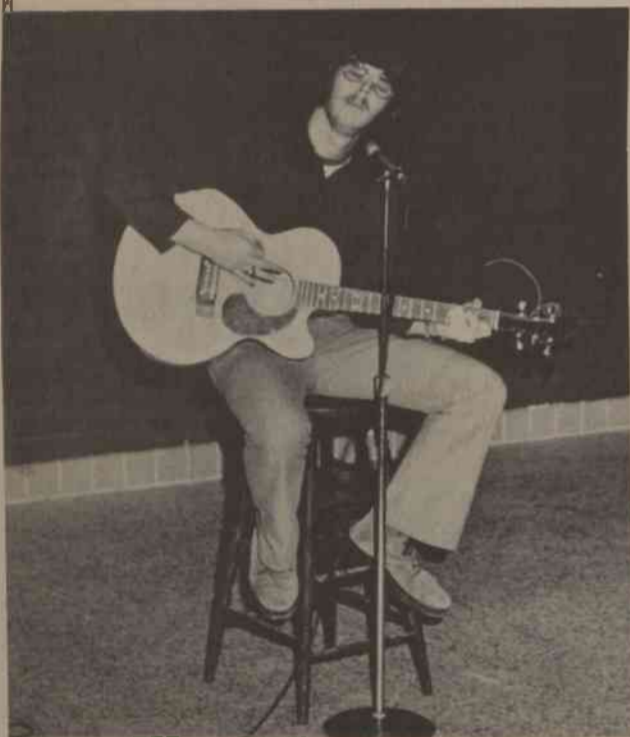

Student Government Talent Show

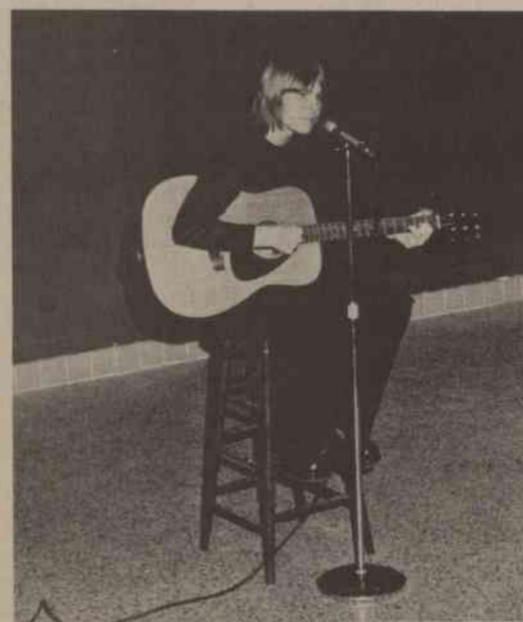
