Arthur Ballard has joined the academic faculty here at the School of the Arts as an instructor of English and Remedial Reading.

Mr. Ballard is a native of Welch, West Virginia, but has traveled so extensively and for such varied reasons that he is hesitant about calling any particular place his home. The major portion of his college education took place at Concord College in Athens, W. Virginia, but he has served in numerous capacities at the Chicago Art Institute and the Universities of Michigan, Montana and Missouri.

For a man with a background mostly liberal and theatrical arts, Mr. Ballard has had a surprising amount of experience in Foreign Relations, particularly in the Middle East and Southeast Asia. It was on this subject that he spoke extensively.

Mr. Ballard has had a deep personal concern in the affairs of the Middle East for almost a decade now, making "about four trips a year there since 1960."

In the late spring of 1967, the Arab-Israeli War effected Mr. Ballard's traveling to Jerusalem (at his own expense) to offer his services to various welfare organizations of the war-torn city. 

To those of you who didn't win, these words of encouragement: At the rate we're going so far -- your chances are good!




